

III. Math Assignment (Rising 2nd—5th grades only)

Required Math Facts in a Flash Rising 2nd graders

Rising 2nd grade students—Each student should fill out the Math Facts in a Flash log included in this packet during the summer. The required time to be logged is 10 minutes per day or 40 minutes per week for a total of 320 minutes for the entire summer. Students may work at the level that will be both review and challenging for them. Students log in to Math Facts in a Flash through the Renaissance Place Home Connect on the St. Luke Website.

Required Review Math Packet rising 3rd—5th graders

Rising 3rd—5th grade students—Each student will be given a math packet to complete over the summer. These math concepts should be a review of all of the concepts which were studied during the year and which the students should have mastered. The journal should be completed and turned in on August 5, 2010, at the Meet-the-Teacher event.

**** These three projects are required (two for Kindergarten and 1st) and a grade will be given for each.**

I. Journal of Summer Happenings Guidelines



Kindergarten and 1st Grade Guidelines

Rising Kindergarteners and rising 1st grade students will be given red folders with blank pages. All journal entries should be made in this folder and should include illustrations and/or other memorabilia.



- at least 6 **dated** and illustrated entries
- words and phrases to go with each entry in the child’s own handwriting
- Memorabilia - movie/park tickets, pamphlets, etc.

All St. Luke 2nd—5th grade students will be given a St. Luke School Composition Book. All journal entries should be made in this book and should include illustrations and/or other memorabilia.

- Illustrations - pictures, postcards, drawings, etc.
- Memorabilia - movie/park tickets, pamphlets, etc.

Please leave 36 sheets in the back of the book blank for use during the upcoming school year!

2nd and 3rd Grade Guidelines



Rising 2nd and 3rd grade students should include...

- at least 8 **dated** entries
- 2-3 sentences per entry to describe what is happening in the pictures

4th and 5th Grade Guidelines



Rising 4th and 5th grade students should include...

- at least 10 **dated** entries
- 4-5 sentences per entry (answer Who? What? When? Where? and Why?) to describe what is happening in the picture



II. Summer Reading Log Guidelines

Rising Kindergarten—5th Grades

All St. Luke students are required to read and record their minutes in a Reading Log. The completed reading log forms should be folded and taped inside their journal. Each journal comes with one reading log inside the front or back cover. Additional reading logs are available on our website. **The total number of minutes that is due for each grade level is based on 8 weeks during the summer.** This should allow for flexibility in the student’s schedule.

Rising Kindergarteners and 1st Graders...

- should read or be read to for at least 10 minutes per day or an average of 40 minutes per week for a grand total of at least 320 minutes

Rising 2nd Graders...

- should read and log at least 15 minutes per day or an average of 60 minutes per week for a grand total of at least 480 minutes

Rising 3rd, 4th and 5th Graders...

- should read and log at least 20 minutes per day or an average of 80 minutes per week for a grand total of at least 640 minutes
