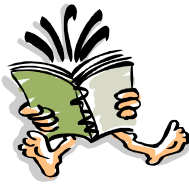

1. Required Reading



You are required to read the two selections below as indicated by grade level. Insure that all reading is documented on the Summer Reading Log. Upon return to St. Luke students will be expected to:

1. Take an Accelerated Reading Quiz on the novels read;
2. Take a Literacy Skills test on the novels read [if available]
3. Take a Vocabulary Quiz on the novels read [if available]
4. Participate in a small and whole group discussion on the novels read

7th Grade Required Reading:

The Wednesday Wars by Gary Schmidt

Boy: Tales of Childhood by Roald Dahl

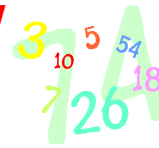
8th Grade Required Reading:

Elijah of Buxton by Christopher Paul Curtis

Tasting the Sky by Ibtisam Barakat

The titles have been selected by the English and Reading Department to represent the best in children's literature. The Wednesday Wars and Elijah of Buxton are 2008 Newbery Honor Books. Esperanza Rising, Boy, and Tasting the Sky represent outstanding selections in historical fiction and non-fiction genres. 2. Required Review Math Packet



In preparation for a successful year in middle school math please study the objectives and complete the problems included in the math packet. The objectives in the packet should have been mastered in your 2008-2009 math class. We encourage you to work each problem with great effort and perhaps study your multiplication tables on a regular basis this summer.

The following procedures should be used for completing your summer math packet:

1. Complete all **even numbered** problems for each of the objectives on loose-leaf notebook paper using pencil. Your work should be organized by objective and placed in a paper notebook with brads and pockets. Please place this summer packet in the pocket of the notebook. Make sure your name is written in ink on both the folder and the math packet.

2. **Show all of your work** for each even numbered problem. **Draw a box or a circle** around your final answer. Make an **answer column** on the right hand side of your notebook paper with your final answers to the assigned problems.

3. Your notebook will be graded for effort and will serve as a significant homework grade(s) for your math class for the first nine week grading period. There will be a grade deduction for incomplete work. After a week or two of reviewing the problems in the packet, a multiple choice assessment drawn directly from the assigned (even numbered) problems will be given. This assessment will serve as a test grade for the first nine week grading period.

4. Your summer math review packet is due on St. Luke's registration day, August 6, 2009, the same due date as your other Lions on the Loose assignments.

3. Required Summer Reading Logs



All St. Luke Middle School students are required to read and record the number of pages and time read on a Middle School Summer Reading Log. The reading log should also list the title of the book, the AR level, AR point value, and AR interest level. Parents will initial ALL entries where indicated. Students should make notes or comments in the space provided to assist with discussion and testing.



Rising 6th, 7th, and 8th Graders...

- **Should read and log at least 20 minutes per day or an average of 80 minutes per week or a total of at least 880 minutes for the entire summer.**
- **Reading Logs will be worth 100 points. Points will be deducted for missing information. Reading Logs are due at registration on Thursday, August 6, 2009.**
